## **Glenn Hill Cemetery Preservation**

You have probably passed by an important and historic cemetery in Rockwall many times without knowing it. The Glen Hill Cemetery is tucked away across the street from Kroger South on Ridge Road. A preservation group, the Glenn Hill Cemetery Preservation Society, has been formed with the mission to carefully clean up the overgrown and neglected site. The Rockwall County Historical Foundation has agreed to assist and recruit volunteers to work alongside members of the Preservation Society in their efforts. Recently the group brought in graduate students from SMU to identify markers. Glen Hill is the resting place of the historic black families of the Chisholm/Chisolm and Martin/Moton families as well as many other early settlers of Rockwall County.
